


February 2nd from 6:30-8:00 pm Birthday Kits and Video Games

United Methodist Corner

One of the key teachings of John Wesley to Methodists is that of grace. Grace is often defined as the unmerited love, mercy and compassion of God that has blessed creation since the beginning of time. John Wesley defined grace as the sum total of all God's gifts and blessings upon humanity from the moment of creation on onward. Unlike many of his contemporaries who believed that God's undeserved love is only given to a select few or God's elect, Wesley maintained that God's grace is available to all. We hear that message echoed in the song, "Come sinners to the Gospel feast, let every soul be Jesus' guest. No need to be left behind, for God hath bid all humankind (UMH #339).

A significant part of our understanding of God's grace is Wesley's teaching on prevenient grace. The word prevenient means the grace that goes before human action. In other words, the presence of the Holy Spirit is working in us long before we ever acknowledge God or receive Christ in our lives. There is great freedom in knowing that we don't have to try to prove our worth or work our way to be accepted. God has accepted us and reconciled us in Christ. All we need to do is to turn towards God's light and live! Those are unaware of God's presence can do good things because God's grace has led them in this way.

One of the Wesley's favorite scriptures that illustrates God's prevenient grace is Psalm 139. We find in verses 7-12 that God is intimately knowledgeable and active in our lives long before we are aware of it. "If I take the wings of the morning and settle at the farthest limits of the sea, even there your hand shall lead me, and your right hand shall hold me fast."

I believe that living in the knowledge and reality of this grace is a great support in our witness and service to others. I remember when I was leading Bible study with the prisoners at the Ozaukee County Jail, I would often witness to them about how God comes to us in love and kindness and not judgement and retribution. I never asked them why they were there. They had broken the law in some way. But we would talk about the future and what future plans may God have for them. Always a key in that future is knowing that God always seeks to reconcile us back to him through the love of Christ in the Spirit. In the words of our communion liturgy, May God lead us to become one with Christ, one with each other and one in ministry to all the world until Christ's comes in final victory and that all of God's people might feast at His heavenly banquet table

Note: Online purchases via a credit card are charged at 2.65% of the purchase, a debit card at 1% of the purchase, and direct pay from your bank is \$0.29 per transaction regardless of your purchase size.

If you prefer not to use the RaiseRight website or app, you can use the form on the counter in the Narthex to get physical cards on the 2nd Sunday of each month.
