

Dear Grand Avenue Church Family and Friends,

I hope everyone had a wonderful Thanksgiving. Now with Thanksgiving behind us, we are set to embark on the season of Advent. Advent begins four Sundays before Christmas and is intended to be a period of spiritual preparation leading up to Christmas Day. Today the Advent Season is more commonly referred to as the Christmas Season.

The Christmas Season is by far our most revered holiday of the year and it is impossible to escape the importance placed upon it in our country. The images of Christmas are everywhere. Our homes and streets are filled with colorful lights and Christmas decorations. Every store and business is promoting the season. There are numerous parades, events, and gatherings. We are constantly inundated with a steady stream of Christmas advertisements on our televisions and phones. No one can doubt that the days leading up to December 25th are dominated and focused on preparing for this celebration.

However, the Season that was originally instituted to provide a period of mindful spiritual reflection on the importance and significance of the birth and return of the Messiah has become increasingly centered on consumerism and not Christ. As I step back and analyze the modern Christmas/Advent Season, I am struck by how little focus is placed on Jesus. In fact, outside of our church communities and activities, there is virtually no mention of our Savior. How strange that a holiday that is so universally known and celebrated worldwide has almost no focus on the reason for its existence.

As we enter this Advent/Christmas Season let us reconnect with the reason for the season. Let our Lord's Word protect us from the bright, glittering lights of commercialism so that we won't be blinded to the true significance of Christmas and the need to pursue more meaningful preparation. Let us prayerfully center all of our preparations and celebrations on Jesus Christ and consciously seek to prepare our hearts to meet our Lord.

John 1:14, "And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen His glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth."

United Methodist Corner

As we approach the Christmas season, I thought it might be helpful to look at John and Charles Wesley's view and understanding of Christmas. You might find it interesting that John never preached a Christmas sermon. He focused his writings and sermons on the grace and salvation that comes to us through the life, death, and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. John and Charles understanding of Christmas centered on the doctrine of the Incarnation and Jesus' teaching in John's Gospel that no one can enter of kingdom of heaven unless they have been born again or born from above.

Both the incarnation and second birth are cited in Charles Wesley's well-known Christmas carol, "Hark! The Herald Angels Sing." The doctrine of the incarnation is a central belief that God became human in the form of Jesus. In verse 2 we sing, "veiled in flesh the Godhead see; hail the incarnate Deity, pleased with us in flesh to dwell, Jesus our Emmanuel." The word Emmanuel, one of Jesus' names in Matthew means "God with us." God is fully with us in Jesus, saving us from our sins and placing us on path of his righteousness. The hope of Christmas is that we are not alone or deserted. God walks with us in Jesus.

In the third verse of Hark the Herald Angels Sing, we sing, "born to raise us from the earth, born to give us second birth". Being born anew in Christ is the work of the Holy Spirit in us. We cannot bring about this second birth any more than we were responsible for our births the first time. Some Christians would emphasize the need to be born again so that we be granted entry into heaven when we die. For Wesley, second birth was also about what the Spirt is beginning to do with us as we give our lives to Christ. The Spirit works to transform us into becoming more Christlike in our love and our discipleship. Christ said, "I have that you may have life (true life) and have it more abundantly (John 10:10).

One of the highlights for Wesley during the Christmas season is the Methodist Watchnight service that is usually held on December 31st. This Watchnight service emphasizes our commitment to renewing our covenant with Christ for the coming year. The service incudes John's well-known Covenant Prayer which I will be examining in next month's column.

May you and your family experience the joy and deep meaning of this season.
