

CHURCH NEWS

A year in review:

As I sit at my desk, looking out the window, watching the snow come down to create what I hope will be that memorable Christmas card scene for our holiday this year, I am drawn back to what the Advent season is all about. It is the celebration of the birth of Jesus Christ over 2000 years ago.

I am blessed daily by my GAUMC family and the impact each of you has on me, my community, and my world. Let me restate that: on us, our community, and our world. A lot has happened at GAUMC in 2024. There have been many blessings and a few opportunities.

Blessings:

- Pastor Vince was officially appointed to Grand Avenue UMC on July 1.
- We have completed the parking lot refurbishment project and paid off all expenses. We still have \$2950 to seed future parking lot maintenance projects.
- A new tenant family moved into the parsonage.
- Enhancing our music program with a new accompanist and choir.
- We have paid our UMC connectional apportionments in full again.
- Installation of two (2) AED devices and training on the usage of AED devices.
- Five (5) year anniversary of our partnership in the Lighthouse Ecumenical Youth Ministry program.
- Development of the Library and Mentoring Program at the Family Promise shelter, including gaining multiple grants from the Wisconsin UMC Foundation.
- Another successful flower sale fundraiser.
- New faces attending our programs and activities. Our ministries have touched every one of them and us.
- Establishing an endowment fund of \$58,900.
- Dave Guse was added as the pastoral assistant.
- We had many opportunities to grow spiritually through learning from the teachings of the Bible.

Opportunities:

- A water leak in the boiler system caused a \$300 water utility bill instead of a \$100 regular bill. Repairs cost us around \$900. All are welcome to make a small "water leak" special offering to help us offset this unexpected cost.
- The passing of some of our long-term members has been sad and difficult, even though we know they are now at peace with our Lord. Their strong faith brought energy into our congregation that we all dearly miss. Please continue to invite friends, neighbors, and others to join us for worship so that we can continue to grow our community.
- Our 2025 liability and property insurance premiums increased by 65%. To reduce the rate increase, the Wisconsin conference is moving to a new insurance provider. Please pray that our conference can move to a new insurer soon and that they can provide reasonable rates so that churches across our nation do not need to sacrifice God's work to cover these costs.

I hope you enjoyed the Advent season and took time to worship the birth of Jesus. We look forward to 2025 and many opportunities to live out our mission statement: *By the grace of God, we seek to love God and to serve humanity as Christ did.*

United Methodist Corner

A prayer that deeply informed John Wesley's theology and preaching has become known as the **Covenant Prayer.** Wesley had adapted the prayer below from his parents (Samuel and Suzanna) Puritan tradition.

"I am no longer my own, but thine. Put me to what thou wilt, rank me with whom thou wilt. Put me to doing, put me to suffering. Let me be employed by thee or laid aside for thee, exalted for thee or brought low for thee. Let me be full, let me be empty. Let me have all things, let me have nothing. I freely and heartily yield all things to thy pleasure and disposal. And now, O glorious and blessed God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, thou art mine, and I am thine. So be it. And the covenant which I have made on earth, let it be ratified in heaven. Amen."

Wesley expected Methodists to pray this prayer at the beginning of each new year as a way of remembering and renewing their baptismal covenant. Wesley did not want Methodists to become complacent in their faith by thinking that since Christ has saved them, that they need not worry about how they were to live their lives. He was concerned about Methodists backsliding, which he defined as those who received Christ's salvation, but have now fallen into habitual sin. Wesley would point out that indeed Christ has died for us, but Jesus also said that anyone who seeks to follow him must deny themselves and take up their cross and follow him. Our egos and the temptations around us can easily lead us from God's path, the path that leads to life.

For me, the key part of the Covenant Prayer are the words, "I freely and heartily yield all things to thy pleasure and disposal." We are to continually seek to do God's will and purpose. I admit that discerning God's will under some circumstances may be difficult. But Biblical writers like Micah give us a vision of what God seeks for us. Micah wrote, "What does the Lord require of you but to "do justice, love kindness and walk humbly with your God. (Micah 6:8). We may not have a perfect vision of God's will, but we know that when we seek to love God (with the help of the Spirit) with all our heart, soul, mind and strength and love our neighbors as ourselves, we are on the right track
